

The COVID epidemic impacted 2021 Activities


COVID19 had a huge impact on society starting early in 2020 and continuing into 2021. In addition to travel restrictions and business shut-downs, church doors were closed by government mandate. Thanks to the efforts of Mike Boyer, Don Keller, Karen Kerski and Pastor Montague, Fork UMC, like many congregations, adapted by 'airing' services via 'Zoom' and later 'live-stream'. When mandates lessened later in 2020 and in-person services could resume, Pastor Montague assembled a team to discuss 're-opening well'. As precautions, Bibles and Hymnals were removed; masks were required at all times; doors remained ajar for improved air circulation; and, to maintain the recommended six (6) foot 'social distance', every other pew was closed off with yellow caution tape. In addition, as the organist played hymns, congregants were asked to speak, not sing, the words. Over time, practices gradually relaxed. Hymnals and Bibles returned in 2021 and masks were only used while singing and while entering or exiting the Sanctuary. Interestingly congregants no longer stood to sing.

Committee meetings were often conducted remotely via Zoom. In addition, concerns over the potential for spreading COVID at large, indoor gatherings (Fellowship Hall), necessitated some schedule adjustments. For example, the annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner was cancelled, and the Homecoming Day celebration was shifted from April to October, resulting in deferring 'Memory Lane Day' to November and combining it with opening the 'Time Capsule' (more on these events later). Outdoor church activities generally proceeded on schedule while instituting measures to maintain recommended 'social distancing'.





The new sign was very timely as we later learned the old sign (left) was rusty & in poor condition. Alas, after the upgrade, area residents complained. The permit, issued in **error** by Balto. 2021 Moves Along

Restricted to outdoor activities by COVID concerns, Marlene Strumsky held the annual Easter Egg Hunt March 27. Children in several age groups scurried about, quickly finding eggs hidden by adults & the youth group. To honor our 250th Anniversary, some special eggs held
 250 cents worth of coins. Take home crafts were also available.

Concerned over the potential for spreading COVID at a large indoor event, **Homecoming** was postponed from April 18 to Oct. 17, 2021.

On May 16, 2021, Strawbridge Shrine curator Helen Kemp (below right) was a guest speaker. In costume, she explained that Robert Strawbridge, a contemporary of Francis Asbury, played a key role in the American Methodist movement. Fork 'Meeting House' was among his many stops, preaching here & helping organize the church. His extensive travels by horseback in the mid-Atlantic area helped give rise to the term 'circuit rider'. 

Among the contents were a Bible, pix of the ground breaking. memorabilia from Sunday School children,

etc. Thanks to Norm Gunnarson for removing the cornerstone to reveal the contents. Another capsule was reportedly buried near the north end of the Ed Bldg. but none could be found. Ken West (a retired BalCo detective) got 'leads' about possible locations from several persons, but fading memories proved inconsistent & 'targets' revealed using metal detectors (Joey Lee, Sam Lee, Ken West & Jim Humphreys) proved to be buried pipes, wires & debris - no time capsule

was found. Perhaps the capsule was relocated during an earlier celebration?




